

Memberships are due NOW! **Speaker:** Tom Noel known as Dr. Colorado History teacher. Presented a display of slides of some of the lesser-known scenes of Colorado's gold country. "Gilpin County is not the place to go gold prospecting. "First Question of the night, "Who was Gilpin County named for? William Gilpin. William Greeneberry Russell found gold on Cherry Creek. And in Russell Gulch, Gilpin county. Willam was a confederate and most of his discovery was not put in the history books. Gold was found in winter in Idaho Springs. Library of congress lists devastation caused by mining, around Central city. Central City became an over night city. Painting 1965 of Central City. 1874 fire, blamed on the Chinese workers and as a results 1874 is found on most building in Central City today Bleak looking place, not much better today. Central city library was the St. Paul's Episcopal Church, there's the opera house. Ann Evans saved the Central City Opera house with many of her friends helping to raise the money to restore and rebuild the Opera as it is today. Her house is still standing and restored. July 16, 1932 Opening night of Central City Opera Lillian Gish was a top actress of her time and opened the Opera House. Ballad of Baby Doe at Opera house. First preformed there. Teller House restored by Opera House association. Úlysses S. Grant room at the Teller House, he never slept there. Each painting in bar has something anatomically incorrect including, Bacchus, Roman God of drinking. The face on the bar room floor. The fanny on the bar room ceiling at the old

Glory Hole saloon. There is a poem that state" With her face in one place and a block and a half in between. "The other side of the face on the bar room floor?? The painting is called "Mother" her eyes follow you. Gold coin saloon, cannot put slots in that saloon. Most famous Madam, Lou Bunchstead. Gambling always being done in Central City. Supposedly done to support schools. Black Hawk was a smelting center. Since gaming much has changed. Hiking above Nevadaville. Americastar Hotel in the back what an eyesore in a beautiful landscape. The glory

hole is still in Nevadaville. Town is left with hotels that never got built. The lace house in Central City. Miner struck

Halfway between black hawk and Central City. Central City Cemetery one of 6 or 8. lots of children in those cemeteries. Look at all the smelters in the back of the picture. Nevadaville only has maybe 6 people left in town. They didn't go with the casinos. Main Street today Town is hardly open anymore. Bookstore and city hall one building.
